Oana Negru-Subtirica is an associate professor at the Department of Psychology, Babes-Bolyai University, where she leads the Self and Identity Development Lab. Her research focuses on the development of intentionality and agency in adolescence and emerging adulthood, from the perspective of identity formation, motivation, and goals. Her work investigates: (a) personal, parental, and social factors that contribute to identity formation in different life domains (e.g., education, occupation, religion); and (b) how motivation and goals are shaped by educational and occupational strivings. She employs quantitative, qualitative, and mixed methodologies to best capture the complexity of intentional pursuits. She is a member of the Governing Council of the Society for the Study of Emerging Adulthood and the Executive Council the European Association for Research on Adolescence. She coordinates large-scale longitudinal and applied studies on identity formation, financed through Erasmus+, ERSTE Foundation, and UEFISCDI. Her work was published in journals like Developmental Psychology, Journal of Vocational Behavior, and Journal of Personality.
